

This quick start chart summarizes the basic setup and operation steps.




### 3 Overview

The Kramer **VP-409** is a high quality low cost converter for up-scaling composite video and s-Video to up to WUXGA. It accepts PAL-B/D/G/H/I, NTSC 3.58, and NTSC 4.43 video formats. This compact, multi-standard unit has a built-in 3D de-interlacer and a 3D comb-filter that ensures superb quality.

### The VP-409 features:

- An external DC source, making it suitable for field operation
- Side-panel buttons for selecting the input source and the output resolution

   indicated by LEDs
- Non-volatile memory that retains the last setting, after switching the power off
   To achieve the best performance:
- Connect only good quality connection cables, thus avoiding interference, deterioration in signal quality due to poor matching, and elevated noiselevels (often associated with low quality cables)
- Avoid interference from neighboring electrical appliances and position your Kramer VP-409 away from moisture, excessive sunlight and dust





### 4 Your VP-409 Video To WUXGA Scaler




Figure 1: VP-409 Video To WUXGA Scaler

Figure 1 and Table 1 define the **VP-409** Video To WUXGA Scaler:

#	Feature	Function
1	5V DC	+5V DC connector for powering the unit
2	CV IN RCA Connector	Connects to a composite video source
3	Y/C I/V 4-pin Connector	Connects to an s-Video source
4	OUTPUT 15-pin HD Connector	Connects to the VGA-WUXGA acceptor
5	INPUT SELECT Button	Press to select between inputs
6	CVLED	Illuminates when the CV input is selected
7	Y/C LED	Illuminates when the Y/C input is selected
8	OUTPUT RES. Button	Press to select the desired output resolution
9	VGA LED	Illuminates when the VGA (640x480) resolution is selected
10	SVGA LED	Illuminates when the SVGA (800x600) resolution is selected
11	XGA LED	Illuminates when the XGA (1024x768) resolution is selected
12	1280x800 LED	Illuminates when the 1280x800 (Wide XGA) resolution is selected
13	1366x768 LED	Illuminates when the 1366x768 (WXGA) resolution is selected
14	WSXGA LED	Illuminates when the WSXGA (1440x900) resolution is selected
15	SXGA LED	Illuminates when the SXGA (1280x1024) resolution is selected
16	1400x1050 LED	Illuminates when the 1400x1050 (SXGA+) resolution is selected
17	1680x1050 LED	Illuminates when the 1680x1050 (WSXGA+) resolution is selected
18	UXGA LED	Illuminates when the UXGA (1600x1200) resolution is selected
19	1920x1080 LED	Illuminates when the 1920x1080 (1080p RGB) resolution is selected
20	WUXGA LED	Illuminates when the WUXGA (1920x1200) resolution is selected

### 4.1 Sync Enable/Disable Output Function

You can setup the unit to automatically disable its sync output signals<sup>1</sup> when no source is connected, so that the display/projector can enter "sleep" mode (that is, turn OFF when no sync is detected).

To toggle between the sync output enable/disable state while no input is connected, do the following:

- Press and hold the input selection button and connect the power supply cable.
- 2. Hold the button until one of the input LEDs flashes for a short time (this takes about 12 seconds).

To identify the current status of the unit, disconnect and reconnect the power cable to start up the unit:

- If both INPUT LEDs flash for a short time, the sync output signals are disabled
- If both INPUT LEDs remain ON during unit startup, the sync output signals are enabled

### 4.2 OSD Information Enable/Disable Function

To toggle between enabling/disabling the OSD information:

- 1. Press and hold the OUTPUT RES. selection button and connect the power supply cable.
- 2. Hold the button until all the resolution LEDs flash for a short time. (This takes about 12 seconds).

## 5 Connecting the VP-409




Figure 2: Connecting the VP-409

To connect the **VP-409**, as illustrated in the example in <u>Figure 2</u>, do the following<sup>1</sup>:

- 1. Connect a composite video source to the CV IN RCA connector (for example, a composite video player) and/or an s-Video source (for example, an s-Video player) to the Y/C 4-pin input connector.
- 2. Connect the OUTPUT 15-pin HD computer graphics video connector to an acceptor (for example, a plasma display).
- 3. Connect the 5V DC power adapter to the power socket and connect the adapter to the mains electricity (not shown in Figure 2).
- 4. Use the:
  - INPUT SELECT button to select the desired input
  - OUTPUT RES. button to select the desired resolution
